**Steve Dyer, 4362 Ridgeview Drive was present and expressed his concern. Mr. Dyer presented a handout regarding the ‘Ohio Department of Education Office of Budget and School Funding’ (attached).**

**Dean Young stated that the meeting was for the use of the property and a text change. Springfield Township is unable to solve the state funding problem. The school presents a viable use for this property. They are investing 700-\$800,000 in the property. Does not see that Towpath is competing with Springfield High School, and the students don’t fit into conventional system. They have discovered they need an education.**

**SECTION 5.04** *USE SPECIFIC STANDARDS*

**(K) CHURCHES AND PLACES OF WORSHIP, CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS, AND EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IN A RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT**

1. The minimum lot area shall be two acres.
2. The minimum lot width shall be 200 feet.
3. All buildings and parking areas shall be set back a minimum of 60 feet from the front lot line.
4. All buildings shall be set back a minimum of 50 feet from all other lot lines.
5. All parking areas shall be set back a minimum of 25 feet from all other lot lines.
6. Such uses should be located on an arterial or collector street (as determined by the Summit County Engineer) or have direct access to an arterial or collector street to minimize impacts on local streets and residential neighborhoods.
7. The BZA may require all outdoor children's activity areas to be enclosed by a fence or wall having a height of at least five feet but not exceeding six feet. An entry gate shall be securely fastened.
8. Associated uses such as a convent, faculty residence, cafeteria, dormitory, field house, or infirmary shall be located on the same lot as the principal use and comply with the building setback requirements set forth in this resolution.

**(L) CHURCHES AND PLACES OF WORSHIP, CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS, AND EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IN A NONRESIDENTIAL DISTRICT**

1. The minimum lot area shall be two acres.
2. The minimum lot width shall be 200 feet.
3. All buildings and parking areas shall be set back a minimum of 60 feet from the front lot line.
4. All buildings shall be set back a minimum of 50 feet from all other lot lines.
5. All parking areas shall be set back a minimum of 25 feet from all other lot lines.
6. Such uses should be located on an arterial or collector street (as determined by the Summit County Engineer) or have direct access to an arterial or collector street to minimize impacts on local streets and residential neighborhoods.
7. Associated uses such as a convent, faculty residence, cafeteria, dormitory, field house, or infirmary shall be located on the same lot as the principal use and comply with the building setback requirements set forth in this resolution.
8. For the protection of students enrolled in the school, a fence or wall having a height of at least 5 feet shall enclose all outdoor activity areas. An entry gate shall be securely fastened.
9. A drop off/pick up location which will not impede traffic on or off the site shall be provided to ensure the safety of the students.
10. The location and design of the school shall provide for the protection of the students from the traffic, noise and other hazards of the area and/or the arterial street location.

11. Educational facilities shall not be located within 1500 of a parcel where liquor is sold and consumed on premises as a primary use such as a bar or tavern.
